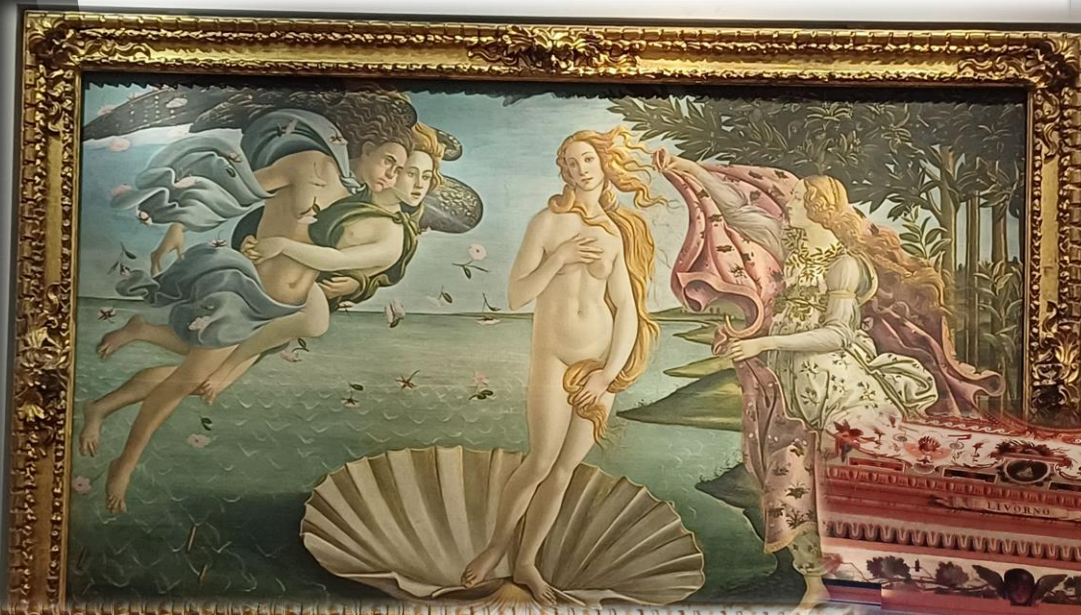
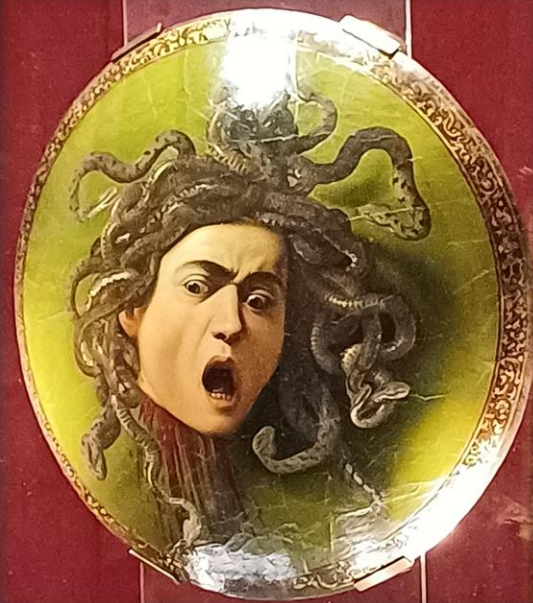

#### SCENE 1

"It's set in the city of Florence, Italy, more than 400 years ago. Florence was the place where art and ideas blossomed during the Renaissance. Imagine narrow, cobblestone streets, beautiful cathedrals, and people talking passionately about science, art, and music. Now, in the late 1500s, a group of super-smart and creative people began meeting in a grand house in Florence. They called themselves the "Florentine Camerata". These were musicians, poets, and thinkers who loved to talk about ancient Greece and Rome. They had a big question: "What would happen if we brought back the way the Greeks performed music, and plays?"

#### SCENE 2

"The Camerata was led by a man named "Giulio de' Medici", who was kind of like the host of a club. His friends included "Francesco Guicciardini", the father of the famous astronomer Galileo, and a composer named "Jacopo Peri", who later became a rock star of their time—well, in an opera sense! They believed that music could tell stories better if it was simple and emotional, rather than the super-compositional style that was popular back then. They wanted music to match the feelings of the words being sung. This idea led to something amazing—"the birth of opera!"

#### SCENE 3

"Section 3: The First Operas"  
"So, when did the Florentine Camerata actually do it? They created something entirely new. Jacopo Peri composed the first operas, including "Dafne" and "L'Euridice". These operas told dramatic stories, with singers acting out characters and an orchestra playing along. Before this, music and theater were separate, but the Camerata brought them together. Imagine watching a story unfold, with music making the emotions bigger and more exciting. That's what opera became—and it all started with the Florentine Camerata!"

#### SCENE 4


"Section 4: Why It Matters to Us"
